<p>Athens Network of Collaborating Experts (ANCE) is a non-profit, non-governmental organization established in 1996 and based in Athens, Greece. ANCE works at local, national, and international level to promote social inclusion, empowerment, and sustainability, with a strong focus on individuals and communities facing social and economic inequalities, including young people, migrants and refugees, women, unemployed individuals, and other underrepresented groups.</p> <p>ANCE's mission is to reduce inequalities by expanding access to education, skills development, employment opportunities, information, and active participation, while promoting gender equality, youth empowerment, environmental awareness, and sustainable development. Environmental responsibility and climate action are cross-cutting priorities embedded in the organisation's work.</p> <p>Since its establishment, ANCE has successfully designed, managed, and implemented over 140 EU-funded and international projects across Europe, Asia, Africa, and Latin America, with extensive experience in transnational cooperation. ANCE also coordinates a wide network of **experts, NGOs, local authorities, universities, research centres, and private-sector actors**, ensuring high-quality implementation, strong quality assurance, and meaningful impact.

Through its long-standing experience and integrated approach, ANCE brings substantial added value to projects addressing **social inclusion, youth participation, gender equality, sustainability, culture, education, and sport**, directly contributing to the project's objectives and impact.

Key Activities

ANCE has a strong track record in the design, management, and implementation of European and international projects addressing **social inclusion, youth empowerment, gender equality, environmental awareness, sport, and culture**. As consortium leader, ANCE is responsible for the **overall coordination, financial and administrative management, quality assurance, monitoring, and reporting** of projects, ensuring timely delivery and compliance with programme requirements. The organisation designs and delivers a wide range of **training activities, capacity-building programmes, workshops, and non-formal learning initiatives**, targeting young people, professionals, and civil society actors, while actively involving underrepresented groups. In parallel, ANCE leads **dissemination, communication, exploitation and awareness raising activities**, ensuring visibility, stakeholder engagement, and transferability of results at local, national, and European level. Through its experience in transnational cooperation, ANCE fosters effective collaboration among diverse partners, supports knowledge exchange, and integrates tested methodologies and innovative practices across projects.

- **Sustainable Seniors: Building Democratic Participation and Environmental Leadership in Older Citizens** (CERV Citizen Engagement) - Sustainable Seniors promotes participatory democracy, cross-sector collaboration, and lifelong civic learning. Older adults (60+) work alongside youth, professionals, and stakeholders to identify environmental challenges, co-create policy proposals, and influence local and regional sustainability strategies. The project also strengthens the capacity of professionals and local authorities to engage older adults in decision-making, ensuring systemic impact. It directly supports EU priorities under the European Green Deal and the European Democracy Action Plan by addressing civic underrepresentation, promoting gender equality and non discrimination, and enhancing citizen participation in environmental governance. By embedding older adult-led initiatives into local policies and building lasting citizen networks, Sustainable Seniors empowers older adults to shift from passive recipients to active co-creators of Europe's sustainable and democratic future.
- **CirqueVibe - Circus 4 Youth Well-being & Inclusion** (Erasmus+ Sport). It aims to improve the well-being, social inclusion, and empowerment of marginalized youth through circus sport-based activities. By combining physical movement, creative expression, and collaborative practice, the project fosters self-esteem, reduces stress, and strengthens the sense of belonging—especially for young people facing socio-economic inequalities or limited access to resources.
- **POWER (Erasmus+ Sport)** – The portrayal of women athletes in sports media aims to address the issues of gender inequalities in sports journalism and media and to contribute to the promotion of an unbiased and non-stereotypical representation of women athletes in media. (ANCE is the coordinator of the consortium)

- **Climb it up – Climbing for Social Inclusion and Diversity** (Erasmus+ Sport) through which we aim to advance inclusivity in the domain of climbing. This initiative is specifically designed to generate fresh insights into how climbing positively influences the development of soft skills and promotes social inclusion. to pinpoint existing barriers to entry within partner countries, to bolster the awareness, capabilities, and competencies of both the climbing community and affiliated organizations, with the ultimate aim of fostering a more diverse and inclusive climbing culture. ANCE is the coordinator of the consortium)
- **BE FESTIVE** (Erasmus + Capacity building in the field of youth). Key project activities include in-depth research on Mediterranean festivities, the creation of an online interactive map to showcase cultural richness, and the development of an Educational Toolkit titled "Learning with Heritage." This toolkit aims to integrate cultural heritage, tradition, and contemporary issues, serving as a resource to empower youth workers and engage young participants. The initiative further involves hosting international and local training sessions for youth workers, emphasizing cross-cultural exchange and the significance of traditional festivities. Additionally, Festival Immersion Programs will be conducted for both youth workers and participants, providing hands-on experiences. (ANCE is the coordinator of the consortium).
- **Equal – together we stand for gender equality** (Europeaid project). The overall project's objective is to contribute to reducing gender-based violence (GBV) in Uzbekistan, and especially in the regions Ferghana, Kashkadarya, and Namangan, where GBV is most prevalent. The project has designed a set of 6 interrelated specific objectives: a. to identify and understand the root causes of domestic violence in Uzbekistan, based on the perceptions on the topic of the general population; b. to raise general and legal awareness of women and girls regarding their rights, and of society in general on domestic violence; c. to strengthen and improve the skills of CSOs' staff through capacity building activities; d. to train journalists and media professionals in promoting gender equality through their work; e. to strengthen the dialogue and networking links between CSOs and other relevant national stakeholders for the development of a strategy on combatting GBV; f. to promote and enhance communication and dialogue on the topic via social media.
- **Creating Bridges (Creative Europe)** The Project stresses that cultural participation and exchange has a strong role to play during crises, as the pandemic has highlighted the numerous benefits of culture and the arts to individual and collective well-being, which holds true for the whole spectrum of participation, from artists to audience. With respect to the ongoing war in Ukraine, it can increase the resilience and mental health of people and strengthen the social inclusion of those displaced. The creation and transnational circulation of art and culture can consolidate existing socio-cultural ties, strengthen social cohesion, promote common EU values, and support the hard hit CC sectors. In that light, the project has set three interrelated specific objectives: (a) to enhance the resilience, mental health, and social inclusion of Ukrainian people and displaced persons through artistic expression and exchange; (b) To strengthen the participation of Ukrainian artists and art workers in Europe and to mainstream Ukrainian culture; (c) to raise awareness and enhance public dialogue about the role of cultural exchanges between European and Ukrainian citizens. It will achieve the above by knitting together art education activities and a series of cultural events, including major events, and smaller open lessons. The events disseminate results while engaging Ukrainian artists and the public, in Greece, Belgium, and Ukraine. The project will benefit UA persons, displaced persons, and art workers directly, and more than 15.000 people indirectly, artists, art workers and the public in all 3 countries.
- **U4EU 2.0 Youth Shaping Europe's Tomorrow (CERV citizens engagement)**. "It is the successor to the "U4EU: Youth Debating the Future of Europe". U4EU 2.0 continues its mission to empower young people to actively shape the future of Europe, with a primary focus on enhancing youth engagement, democratic participation, and policy advocacy. Building upon the established U4EU youth network and the foundation laid by its

predecessor, U4EU 2.0 encompasses a multifaceted approach. It features a series of youth summits, thematic workshops, training sessions, policy development, and advocacy efforts conducted in nine EU countries. These activities address critical challenges faced by young people, including limited engagement in policy-making, awareness gaps regarding EU institutions and policies, digital literacy deficiencies, and disparities in gender and diversity participation.

We are also now partners in the following projects:

- **European Odyssey: Navigating Through History, Science, and Values** (Erasmus+ KA220-YOU). The main objective of European Odyssey is to enhance youth participation and support educators and youth workers through innovative tools and approaches that encourage collaboration, creative learning, and cultural heritage understanding. Specifically, the project seeks to provide high-quality educational resources, strengthen intercultural exchange, and promote European values in education and civil society.
- **GER-GRE VISION: For a Visionary, Inclusive, Sustainable, Innovative, Open-Minded and Networked Youth Work in Germany & Greece** (Erasmus+ KA210YOU). The main objective is to enhance youth engagement by promoting non-formal education and cross border collaboration, fostering intercultural learning and active citizenship.
- **Change Cup** (Erasmus+ KA220ADU). The project promotes social and professional inclusion of migrants in the culinary sector while fostering sustainable food practices and intercultural exchange.
- **Don't (meno) PAUSE** is an Erasmus+ Sport project promoting physical activity among women aged 40–60 in perimenopause and menopause. It tackles low activity levels and gender gaps in sport by offering evidence-based exercise programs, expert video modules, a multilingual digital handbook, an online support platform, and community events. The project empowers women to stay active, improves health and well-being, and supports EU and WHO policies on healthy lifestyles and equal access to sport.
- **VOICE** (CERV – CITIZENS – CIV). The VOICE project is an initiative aiming to foster active European citizenship among young people aged 18–35, of migrants and second generation youth, especially women, who often face greater barriers to civic and political engagement. In response to widespread political disengagement and a growing sense of disillusionment with institutions, VOICE seeks to reconnect youth with democratic processes through inclusive, community-driven initiatives.
- **CRAFTWISE: A Collaborative Apprenticeship Program for Youth and Crafts Professionals** (Erasmus+ KA220-YOU). The project develops an innovative apprenticeship model that promotes knowledge exchange between generations, connecting design students with craft professionals. Its aims are to preserve traditional crafts, integrate digital tools and business skills, and strengthen youth employability and entrepreneurship.
- **RISE: Resilience, Integration, and Support through (psycho)Education for migrants and refugees in Greece and Spain** (Erasmus+ Small-scale Partnerships in Adult Education). The project develops an inclusive psychoeducational model designed to strengthen the mental health, resilience, and social integration of migrants and refugees in Spain and Greece. It aims to reduce stigma around mental health, empower vulnerable groups with coping tools, and foster community cohesion and empathy between host and migrant populations

- **Green Tick** - The regulation and Systematization of Social Media Content and Digital Apps Related to Health, Diet, and Sport (Erasmus + sport) which examines whether social media and digital apps related to health, diet, and sports are convenient, reliable, and confirm. The “Green Tick” project works as a kind of pathfinder and, at some point, a control mechanism. The project seeks to establish an umbrella organization to deliver labels (Green Tick) to social media accounts and digital apps that produce verifiable and reliable health, diet, and sports content. Thereby, it seeks to enhance knowledge related to physical activity, health, and diet and consequently ensure an increase in participation in the sport of young people in a healthy way throughout the EU by providing guidelines, training, and control mechanisms. (Erasmus+ Sport)
- **Youth Care (Erasmus+ Capacity building for Youth)**. The project is a structured effort of 5 civil society organizations to bring the theme of environmental preservation and action at the center of attention for young people living in disadvantaged areas (and in direct touch with natural environmental resources). The project is led by Beyond Barriers Association in consortium with 4 other organizations with expertise in environment and non-formal education. This project is anchored in our belief that the environment is a crosscutting theme of the future. Therefore, it must be incorporated in the work of all civil society organization despite their scope of work. Moreover, given its complicated nature, the environment problem should be tackled from all levels (individual, inter-personal, structural and society).

On the other hand, ANCE has great experience in the design and implementation of projects such as adult education promoting human rights, combatting discrimination, gender equality, culture and arts sustainability, and active citizenship. Below are some of the already completed projects in the above mentioned fields:

Integrating Sustainability in Athlete’s dietary choices - Sustdiet (Erasmus KA2) with the main aim the promotion of sustainable food consumption and facilitating the shift to healthy, sustainable diets for professional and nonprofessional athletes. (E+KA2 Adult Education (partner)

SIGWAY with the main aim to promote sports and healthy leisure activities outdoors by stimulating sports activities offered in greenways and potential greenways (Erasmus+ sport) (partner).

Alliance for Green Entrepreneurship (AGE); It aims to foster sustainable entrepreneurship education and create specialized and learner-driver education materials and resources dedicated to the development of competencies for circular economy models (E+ KA2 Adult Education).

Youth Debating the Future of Europe (U4EU).; It aimed to encourage democratic and civic participation of young citizens and give them an opportunity to express their concerns and vision towards common challenges related to the European identity, diversity and the future of Europe (Europe for Citizens program).

BestBonds - extending the competencies of adult educators; It aimed at extending and developing the competences of educators and other personnel who support adult learners (Erasmus+ KA2 Adult Education).

A new approach on cultural learning for promoting the social inclusion of migrants and refugees (NEST); It aimed to foster an enabling environment that will allow their integration and active participation in the host communities. (Erasmus + KA3)

Soft Skills Outside of a School Learning Environment (Soul Skills); It aims to provide information about the effects of social isolation due to the COVID-19 pandemic as well as to create educative materials to support the development of children’s aged 6-12 soft skills (E+KA2 Adult Education).

Relate- Finding Stories to embrace our Planet's limits; The overall objective of the project is to contribute to overcoming the strong barriers and post-factual trends which currently stand in the way of a social-ecological transformation needed to tackle the present fundamental challenges the EU and the world faces with regard to issues like climate change, biodiversity loss, land degradation, ocean pollution and acidification, and others (E+ Capacity Building).

Multiple Intelligence - New Approach for Effective Education (MI-NAEE); It aimed to develop and present an innovative pedagogical technology based on the scientific results about the learning processes of the individuals. It was focused on Multiple Intelligence theory. (Erasmus + KA2).

SKILLS MATCHING AND REAL-TIME LMI/ SMART LMI ; The project's aim was to develop an innovative digital solution that allows both careers practitioners and their clients easily understand emerging job trends, changes to the labor market, and how best to manage their skills to meet this. **(Erasmus+ KA3)**

Travel Transformation; The project's aim was is to contribute to overcoming the barriers which currently stand in the way of the transformation needed to tackle the present fundamental social-ecological challenges by building capacities for transformative literacy and transformative competencies to be passed on to the younger generations. (Erasmus+)

Capacities for climate changes; The overall objectives of Capacities 4 Climate Change were that youth workers and youths in Germany, Spain, Greece, Ecuador, Mexico, Chile, and throughout the European Union and Latin America grasp, understand, reflect and communicate the importance of local, regional and global climate adaptation needs, policy and strategies and that they are enabled to develop competences and to take up responsibility for the importance of young people's active role in shaping the pathways for the upcoming transformation processes towards climate adaptation. **(Erasmus Plus - KA2 Cooperation for innovation and the exchange of good practices - Capacity Building in the field of Youth).**

Radar - Regulating Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Racism The project aimed to 1) Establish tangible criteria to identify different forms of racism and xenophobia, distinguishing between ethnic/'racial' marked violence and what we will call 'non-marked' violence. 2) Extend the above criteria to establish ways in distinguishing between physical and non-physical ethnic/'racial' marked offenses, based on verbal, paraverbal (voice), and visual (images) communication practices, in written, spoken, and interactional discourses.
